Teachers' Feedback On curriculum- 2013-14

Objectives of the feedback 2013-14:

Since an affiliated college has no role in designing the curriculum of programmes and syllabi of courses, IQAC of Sullamussalam Science College usually conducts curriculum survey of teachers when University of Calicut introduces major changes in the curriculum design. Through such survey feedback IQAC can take necessary actions to enable teachers to adapt with the newly designed course curriculum. Calicut university introduced vast changes in curriculum after the implementation of Choice Based Credit Semester System (CBCSS) and through the feedback taken from teachers IQAC made necessary changes in the process of curriculum implementation.

About the Survey.

IQAC conducted the survey through structured questionnaire and 55 out of 59 teachers responded to the questionnaire. Data collected, analyzed and findings are summarized. IQAC submits the feedback to college council and the suggestions from teachers were brought to the notice of University through the members of Board of studies (BOS) and Academic Council.

Profile of Teachers.

For the survey, basic details about the teachers such as name, teaching department, years of experience etc were collected and analyzed to get a clear idea about the respondents of the survey.

Analysis of feedback gives a bird's eye view of teacher's opinion regarding the curriculum design. The overall structure of the curriculum has high level of agreement(mean score 3.76). But things like interdisciplinarity (mean score 2.89) and international standards comparability (mean score 2.96) are not up to the expectations on the basis opinion of the teachers and need some attention by the

university. Recommendations to members of Board of Studies were given after the approval of IQAC through academic council of the college.




Diagram 1. Level of teachers agreement on Curriculum.
