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Healing and Building: Nurturing Civic Sense

The vision of education of the Sullamussalam Science College is to produce a generation of young scholars who are intellectually competent, morally upright, and socially committed. Educating the mind is a great venture we have undertaken in the name truth. The institution strives to improve the status of rural marginalized through education, to mould the personality and develop the career of young generation and to help to develop a humane and a strong civic sense. The college aims to make an earnest effort in creating a youth force, genuinely committed to society, its people and the environment. The core values of college are academic excellence and integrity, outstanding teaching and service, scholarly research and professional leadership, integration of teaching, research, and service, individual and collective excellence, diversity, equity, and social justice, education of individuals across the life span, and collegiality and collaboration.

In this section, we highlight the performance of the institution in the area of promoting and developing a humane outlook and a strong civic sense. The Institution acknowledges its commitment to society through various initiatives like *Santhwanam* , *House a Year*, *Kaniv*, and *Pain and Palliative forum*.

Santhwanam, a club to help the needy in the neighborhood of the college came into existence in the year 2008. Since the inception, the club has organized various programs on the campus to make the students aware of the importance of charity works. The objectives of the forum are to eradicate starvation and hunger from the neighborhood of the college, to provide medical assistance to the needy people of the neighborhood of the college, and to inculcate the values of love, mercy, willingness to work for the poor among the students through social services. All the degree students are members of the club. Two students are selected from each class as the representatives and they form the executive body of the club. The club Secretary collects the requirements of the needy people and prepares a list of requirements to purchase the food materials.

Another unique venture taken up by the college is ***House a Year***. There are many poor homeless people in the neighborhood of the college. The institution as a whole decided to build as many homes as it can to realize its dream of house for all in Areekode. So far seven houses have been built by the institution with help from management, principal, teachers, students, and parents. The construction of the next house is in progress. Objectives of this scheme are to eradicate poverty from the neighborhood of the institution, to inculcate positive values in the students, to bring together the college and community, and to ensure all round development of the students. Students plaster the walls, build walls, do the slab work, and paint the house.

The students and teachers reach out to the patients through its **Palliative Care** unit. The palliative care unit in the college began its activities in collaboration with the palliative care clinic at Areekode in 2009. In 2011, an independent unit was set up. **Students Initiative in Palliative Care (SIPC)** Volunteers have undertaken projects like Home care, Fund raising, and creation of awareness among the students and general public about palliative care. Student volunteers from Sullamussalam Science College, Areekode visit the houses of bedridden patients every week so as to provide palliative care and to distribute medicine. They organize activities to uplift the bed-ridden patients by organizing cultural events. They also work closely with the 'Pariraksha' Project. They organize blood donation camps in the college. Students and teachers make regular contribution to this forum.

Kaniv (Student Aid Fund) is a platform to help the students who come from poor families. Books, study aids are given free of cost to the needy students. Financial assistance is given to help the needy to pay their course and examination fees. The objectives of *Kanivare* to bring equity on the campus, to reduce rich poor divide, and to inculcate the values of love, mercy, and care. Money is raised from students every week. Staff members also contribute to the fund. Principal, with the help of the staff members find out the needy and reach out to them. To conclude the college organizes many programs which are related to its vision.

SANTWANAM

A club is formed for the helping the needy in the neighbourhood of the college.

Objectives

- Eradicate starvation and hunger
- To provide medical assistance to the needy people of the neighbourhood
- Personality development of the student through the charity work
- Inculcating the values of love, mercy, willingness to work for the poor among the student through social services

History

In the year 2008, NSS volunteers of our college conducted a socio-economic survey in the adopted village. Perumparamba(Great land) was the adopted village of NSS on that year.

Survey report reveal the actual picture of the society of Perumparamba. Most of the people live in high economic status, but a minority have no shelter, food and medicine.

In that survey we found that a lady is living in a dirty one room house, and in another family mother and son have mental disease and no one to care them. These type of facts was very shocking to the NSS volunteers and program officers. So they decided to form a charity club for helping the needy neighborhood of the college.

Working Style

All degree students are the members of the santwanam club. In each class two students are selected as representative and they became the members of Executive body of the club From this selected executive members elect Secretary, Joint Secretary and treasurer of the club.

Every month representative of the class collect the money from the class and handover this amount to the treasurer of the club. Treasurer collect money from all classes and keep the record of income and expenditure. Treasurer is the custodian of the record.

Club Secretary every month collect the requirements of the needy people and prepare a list of requirements and then purchase the food materials. Packing the kit and then the distribution is the duty of Executive members.

Major Activities:

Every month Santwanam provides food grains to the needy people, Six families availing this facility. Every month volunteers provide medicine to the needy people, two families availing this facility. Two houses were repaired by the volunteers of Santwanam club.

KANIVU

Kanivu, a fund of charity was started twenty years ago, collecting contributions from the staff and students of the college. The fund was set up with an objective of providing financial aid to the poor students of the college and the very needy people who approach the college for aid from time to time.

Objectives

The objectives of the club are

- to help the students from financially backward families.
- to cultivate in the students values like cooperation and empathy.
- to develop kindness of the students through charity works.
- to inculcate helping mentality of students by helping their own friends.
- to bridge the gap between society and the student community.
- to cultivate democratic spirit and leadership qualities.
- to increase the commitment of the students towards the society.

Manner of Work

The institution, since its inception gives great significance to charity works. Since the college is located in the backward district, Malappuram, there are so many financially weak students who hail from minority communities and scheduled caste and tribe. The principal and the tutors in charge of each class find out the struggling students and extend financial help to them. Free meals, free books and waiving of tuition and examination fees are some of the major initiatives taken up by this club.

The students and staff make their contributions to the fund once in a week. On every Wednesday, fund is collected from students and teachers. This day is observed as Kanivu Day. A

student volunteer collects the amount from all classes and from staff on Kanivu Day and this amount is handed over to the principal.

The Principal prepares the list of eligible students after consultations with the concerned tutors and distributes the amount in a strictly confidential manner. This fund is also used to provide financial aid to those people who are ill, poor, helpless, and are desperately in need of financial aid.

A House A Year

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Sullamussalam Science College is running at Great Land, a rural, backward area of Areekode Panchayath in Malappuram District. There are colonies of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe in the neighborhood of the college where many families belonging to minority community reside. The college is concerned with Institutional Social Responsibility and gives prime importance to the problems of under privileged people who lives near the campus. As a part of its social outreach Programme, every year the college in collaboration with the NSS unit conducts many socio-economic surveys to find out the needy people in the neighboring villages so as to extend a helping hand in the form of food , clothes and shelter. The NSS unit also makes regular visits to the homes of the bed –ridden patients to provide home care and free supply of medicines. ‘A House a Year Scheme’ is a unique venture the institution has taken up recently for the welfare of people in need of better housing facilities.

As mentioned above, the number of people in need of better accommodation is high in the neighborhood of the college. The institution has looked in to this problem seriously and collectively taken the decision to build as many houses as possible and designed a plan targeting each people who are deprived of better housing facility. The college within its limitations has taken up this task earnestly. So far five houses have been built by the institution with help from management, principal, teachers, students, and parents. These houses are handed over to the poorest of the poor. The NSS unit is assigned with the maintenance duty of these houses. The survey to find out another needy Family has already been started

Objectives of the 'House a Year Scheme'

- To eradicate poverty from the neighbourhood of the institution.
- To ensure that all family will have homes in Areekode.
- To inculcate positive values and service mentality in the students.
- To bridge the rich –poor gap.
- To bring together the college and community.
- To ensure all round development of the students.
- To ensure stability for families and children
- To increase the awareness and commitment of students towards the society.
- Students to gain the training to take up challenging social assignments

Methods To Find Out The Needy Family

Since the institution is located in a remote area of a socially and economically backward district, there are many families without basic living facilities. Since building homes for every homeless family within a year is not possible, the institution finds out the most deserving family through various socio-economic surveys. NSS unit of the college conducts a survey in the neighboring villages and makes a list of the families below the poverty line. About six to seven families are short listed after the survey. The college council, and the NSS Programme officers and NSS advisory committee choose the most deserving family after taking opinion with the college *Ayalkoottam*.

Fund Raising

The expenditure for the project is collectively raised by the management, the teachers, the students and the parents together. The major share of the expense is met through public funding. The NSS unit prints receipt book and hands over it to all students and the student volunteers visit each and every house in the neighborhood for fund collection. The major share for the construction is collected by the students and the remaining expense is met by the institution.

Construction of the Houses

Students play an active role in all the stages of construction of the houses. They help to build the walls, plaster the walls, do the slab work, and paint the house. The willingness and dedication of students to volunteer in such activities help reducing the construction cost also it creates a feeling of oneness among students.

Description of the House

The college builds the houses with all basic facilities. Houses with one sit out, one dining hall, one bed room, a kitchen, a toilet, and a bathroom are built. The expense for plumbing and electrical works are also met by the college.

Profile of ‘A House A Year’

House 1

The dream project of ‘A House A Year’ was realized when first house was inaugurated in 2004 and presented to poor homeless family of Dasan, Who has been living in the neighborhood of the college for years. The fully furnished house had one sit out, a hall, a bed room, a kitchen, a toilet and a bathroom. The cost of the house was about one Lakh rupees



The house was constructed by the active participation of the NSS volunteers in various process of construction from fund raising to construction works. The key giving ceremony was held in the college on 13th October 2004. The key was handed over by Ummachakutty, President Areekode block Panchayath to the family

of Dasan. Dr.P.P Abdul Haque, Principal presided over the function. NSS Programme officer N.K. Anwar welcomed the gathering and P. Musthafa Farooque presented the report. V.K. Kamala, Areekode Grama Panchayath President, Dr. K. Mohammed Basheer, Dr. A.Nujum spoke on the occasion.



House 2

The second house of this project was a reconstruction work of a house of Ms. Karthyayani who lives near by college. She lives at Ugrapuram, Areekode. The maintenance work and roofing expense was about two Lakhs rupees.



The work was completed successfully by the active participation of the NSS volunteers and the key was handed over in 2009.

House 3

The third house of this project was accomplished in 2010. A concrete house was constructed for a poor homeless family of Ms. Ayisha who resides in the neighbourhood of the college. She is a widow with two children and she is aged. She is living right opposite to the college. The fully furnished house had one sitting room, one hall, one bed room, a kitchen, a toilet and a bathroom. The expenditure was about three Lakhs rupees.





The house was successfully accomplished because of the enthusiastic participation of the NSS volunteers. The key giving ceremony was held in the college on 3rd March 2010. The key was handed over by Dr. K. Mohammed Basheer, the principal to the family. Mr. Shameem Kappan, NSS Programme Officer presided over the function. P.P. Safarulla, Areacode Grama Panchayath, Prof. N.V. Abdurahiman, Manager and Zahira Rahman, HoD of English Department spoke on the occasion.

House 4

The fourth house of this project was completed in the year 2011. A concrete house was build for a poor homeless family of Abdul Azeez, Karatil House, V.K Padi, Areekode.He is a visually challenged person and has a wife and four children.



The fully furnished house have one sit out, one hall, one bed room, a kitchen, a staircase, atoilet and a bathroom. Three Lakh rupees was the total expenditure for the construction.



The house was constructed by the collective participation of the NSS volunteers. The key giving ceremony was held in the college on 6th January 2011. The key was handed over by Ms. Zuhra Mampad, President Areekode Panchayat , Malappuram District. Dr. K. Mohammed Basheer, Principal, presided over the function. NSS programme officer A.M. Jabir Amani welcomed the gathering and Mr. Sirajudheen P.K presented the report. P.P. Safarulla, Areacode Grama Panchayath, Prof. N.V. Abdurahiman, Manager, P.V. Manaf spoke on the occasion.

House 5

The fifth house of this project was also a renovation and modification of the house of Ms. Ayisha. She is a widow and living single. The construction work was completed in 2012. The house was a single roomed, and the NSS unit extended the house with a new sit out and a kitchen. The house was in the adopted village (Vietnam Colony, Ugrapuram) of NSS unit. The cost for renovation and modification was around 1.5 Lakh rupees.



House 6

The sixth house of this project was completed in 2013. A concrete house was constructed for a poor homeless widow, Ms Shareefa, who is living in the Vietnam colony, Ugrapuram, the adopted village of the NSS unit of the college. The fully furnished house had one sit out, one hall, two bed rooms, a kitchen, a toilet and a bathroom. The house cost about four Lakh rupees.

The house was constructed by the active participation of the NSS volunteers. The key giving ceremony was held in the college on 24th September 2013. The key was handed over by Biju, Malappuram District Collector. Prof. Mohammed Ilyas, Principal presided over the function. NSS programme officer TPO Ashraf Ali welcomed the gathering and presented the report. NV Abdul Rahman, manager, KP Mohammed Basheer, Akshya Secretary, Malappuram, and PP Safarullah , President, Areekode Grama Panchayat spoke on the occasion.





House 7

The work of seventh house of this project was completed in 2013. A concrete house was constructed for a poor homeless widow, Ms K.P Sathya, who is living in the Vietnam colony, Ugrapuram, the adopted village of the NSS unit of the college. The fully furnished house had one sit out, one hall, two bed rooms, a kitchen, a toilet and a bathroom. The house cost about seven Lakh rupees.

Students Initiative in Palliative Care

The objectives of the SIPC wing at Sullamussalam Science college is to offer medical and palliative care, and financial assistance to the weak, the elderly, and those suffering from chronic diseases like cancer. The SIP offers psychological, social, spiritual support to the needy in the neighborhood of the college.

Another aim of this forum is to encourage students to reach out to the society, which will help mould them as ideal citizens who will be an asset to the nation. Palliative care unit is aimed at inculcating the values of love, mercy, willingness to work for the poor among the students through social services

Malappuram, being one of the most backward district in Kerala has a huge number of population belonging to backward classes who cannot afford advanced medical and health care facilities.

Areekod, a village in Malappuram where the college is situated is surrounded by colonies of labourers who belong to the socially and economically backward classes. Because of pollution from neighboring industrial factories, like the Mavoor Gwalior Rions, The percentage of people suffering from cancer in the vicinity of the college was very high. It was in this context, the college decided to employ students to offer voluntary care and assistance to deprived population in our neighborhood.

Students in Palliative Care (SIPC), an offshoot of Institute of Palliative Medicine (IPM) is a platform for our students to reach out to the needy and weak in the neighboring community. It is an excellent forum for students to bond with the community in and around the institution. The palliative care unit in the college began its activities in collaboration with the palliative care clinic at Areekode in 2009. In 2011, an independent unit was set up. This unit was known as students' initiative in palliative care. There is a consistent dialogue between the clinic at Areacode and the palliative unit in the college.

The Palliative Care Unit that conducts a range of activities aimed at promoting palliative care education and awareness. One of the key activities of the unit is to provide training and education to healthcare professionals and students. They conduct regular training sessions, workshops, and seminars on various topics related to palliative care, including pain management, communication skills, and end-of-life care. In addition to providing education and training, the unit also offers practical support to patients and their families. They work closely with local healthcare facilities and community organizations to provide home-based palliative care services and support to patients and families in need.

This includes providing medical equipment, medications, and other supplies, as well as offering emotional and spiritual support. The unit also engages in research activities, conducting studies on various aspects of palliative care, including patient outcomes, quality of life, and caregiver experiences. They use the findings from their research to inform their practice and improve the quality of care they provide.

Another important activity of the unit is community outreach. They organize awareness campaigns and events, such as health camps and palliative care fairs, to raise awareness about the importance of palliative care and to promote their services. They also work with local schools and colleges to educate students about palliative care and to encourage them to get involved in volunteer activities.

Overall, the Palliative Care Unit at Sullamussalam Science College is a dedicated team that is committed to promoting palliative care education and providing practical support to patients and families in need. 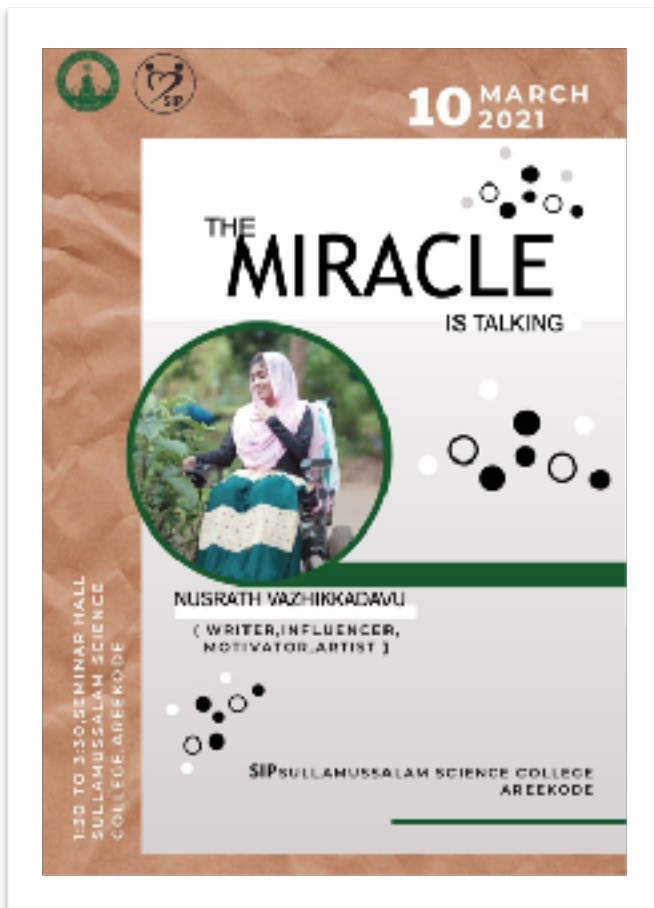
KOOTT
