




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


Shortlisted for best Project at Al Shifa College, Perinthalmanna

Students attended Invited Student talk series at Al Shifa Arts and Science College, Perinthalmanna on 7th July 2023.








Exciting Career Opportunities after Graduation on 7th September 2023 by UnAcademy.






RP: Sajith sir

Topic: Mathematics for Economics.







Further, he holds M.Phil. in Financial Economics and M.A. in Applied Economics from the University of Hyderabad, and Pondicherry University, India, respectively. He obtained his Bachelor (BA) degree from the Silver Jubilee Residential Degree College, Kurnool, AP, India.

He has published over 70 international peer reviewed journal articles such as Review of Quantitative Finance and Accounting, Energy Economics, Economic Modelling, Tourism Management, Annals of Tourism Research, Journal of Travel Research, Journal of Sustainable Tourism, Emerging Markets Review, etc.






