Workshop on Local History Writing

The workshop featured an engaging session by Mr. Shebeen Mehaboob, a journalist and PhD scholar from MG University. His presentation covered the fundamentals of local history writing, including methods of research, sourcing oral histories, archival exploration, and the importance of presenting local narratives within a broader historical framework.

A total of 30 selected students from the BA Communication and Media -History programme participated in the workshop. The students actively engaged in interactive discussions and group activities, where they practiced drafting historical narratives based on their write up on their local history.



Ernad - Ponnani Heritage Walk

Sullamussalam Science College, Areekode, organised the Ernad-Ponnani Heritage Tour during November 1, 2024. The heritage walk, organised in search of the history and heritage of the anti-British struggles of Ernad and Valluvanad, was a novel experience to the participants.

College Manager Prof. N. V. Abdurahiman, flagged off the event which was organised by the departments of History and Journalism as part of the 80th anniversary of Sullamussalam Institutions and the 30th anniversary of Sullamussalam Science College.

The heritage walk, headed by Shebeen Mehboob, journalist and researcher, was attended by around 50 people from different parts of the district.

During the programme, the participants visited the various locations such as the tomb of Ensign

Wyse at Manjeri Boys School premises, the The British Police Outpost at Mudikode, the tombs of Pookkottur war martyrs, Malappuram Mosques, Lancaster's tomb, various ancient churches in Ponnani, Azheekkal village and Layam Music club.



Third Edition of Heritage Walk

The Department of History and Journalism organized the third edition of the Heritage Walk on October 19, 2024, aimed at introducing the second-year students of BA Communication and Media & History to the rich historical and cultural heritage of the region.

The group then proceeded to Kappad, the famous beach where Vasco da Gama first landed in India in 1498, a pivotal moment in Indian history. The students explored the historical relevance of the site, learning about the impact of European exploration and the ensuing cultural interactions.

The final stop was Iringal, where students visited the Kunjali Marakkar museum. Throughout the walk, students actively participated in discussions led by faculty members and were encouraged to observe and reflect on the local history that shaped the region's identity. The walk was not only a learning experience but also an opportunity for students to engage with their heritage in a meaningful and personal way.




Add-On course in Graphic Design launched
