Second Edition of the SMILE Programme

A team of ten girl students and three staff from Manthan Sikshak Sansthan, an alternative education initiative in Kotri village of remote Rajasthan visited Sullamussalam Science College, Areekode, as part of the SMILE 2019 between 29 September to 6 October 2019.

SMILE (Sullamussalam- Manthan Integrated Learning Exchange Programme) is a cultural exchange initiative of Sullamussalam Science College and Manthan, an NGO which works on empowering marginalized and excluded communities in 60 villages of Ajmer and Nagaur districts of Rajasthan.

The interns from Manthan, who are pursuing their high school studies, spent nearly one-week time at the campus interacting with the campus community and experiencing the tradition, culture and uniqueness of our state. They visited the departments, nearby schools and anganawadis and interacted with the staff and students to experience the educational system in the state.

Designed as a national cultural exchange programme, the SMILE project was launched last year and 11 students and two staff from Sullamussalam Science College had spent 10 days in Rajasthan villages exploring their culture and observing socio- economic conditions there.



PROGRAMME ACTIVITIES AND HIGHLIGHTS

Interaction with Heads and Campus Visit

The interns began their Kerala journey with an interaction with the Manager, Principal, Heads of Departments of Sullamussalam Science College. They explored the college's departments, laboratories, and studio, engaging in hands-on activities such as scientific experiments and news reading exercises, which gave them a glimpse into innovative educational practices.

Interaction with Students

The interns actively interacted with college students and student union members, exchanging thoughts on academics, campus life, and sociocultural experiences. These sessions strengthened the bond between the two institutions and fostered meaningful dialogue.

Exploring Kerala's Education System

To understand Kerala's unique approach to education, the delegation visited a spectrum of educational institutions, from kindergarten to higher secondary schools, gaining first-hand insights into the state's holistic and inclusive educational framework.

Visit to SOHSS and Cultural Performances

A highlight of the programme was the visit to the Sullamussalam Oriental Higher Secondary School (SOHSS), where the participants were mesmerized by cultural performances such as Oppana, Kolkali, and Daff Muttu during the School Arts Fest. This event provided an authentic cultural exchange, showcasing Kerala's artistic traditions.

Home Visits and Community Engagement

As part of their immersive experience, the delegates visited local homes and communities, where they observed the daily lives of Kerala's residents. This interaction deepened their understanding of the region's socio-economic conditions and fostered a sense of inclusivity.

Trip to Wayanad

The delegates embarked on an unforgettable trip to Wayanad, visiting Thusharagiri Waterfalls, Pookode Lake, and Muthanga Wildlife Sanctuary. For many participants, this was their first experience of lush green hills, cascading waterfalls, and a wildlife safari. This exposure to Kerala's natural beauty left a lasting impression.

Calicut Beach Visit

The group also visited Calicut Beach, where many of them saw the ocean for the first time. This visit was a moment of awe and inspiration, highlighting the geographic diversity of India.

Urban Exploration

The programme included visits to modern landmarks such as HiLite Mall, Calicut Planetarium, and SM Street, allowing participants to explore Kerala's blend of tradition and modernity.

OUTCOMES AND REFLECTIONS

The second edition of the SMILE programme was a transformative experience for the participants from Manthan Sikshak Sansthan Academy. The participants gained a profound understanding of Kerala's vibrant traditions, educational achievements, and lifestyle.

Observing Kerala's education system inspired discussions on innovative and inclusive educational practices, which the participants can adapt in their own contexts. Interactions with students, faculty, and local residents reinforced the core objective of cultural exchange, leaving both hosts and visitors with valuable friendships and shared experiences.

Visits to Wayanad, Calicut Beach, and urban centers like HiLite Mall provided the delegates with an enriched perspective of Kerala's natural beauty, modern infrastructure, and cultural diversity.
